The PhD Directed Studies Course (Course Code AM9004) is for students who wish to gain knowledge in a specific area for which no graduate level classes are available. Students who are approved to take the course are assigned a suitable class advisor most familiar with the proposed content. Students are required to present the work of one term (not less than 90 hours in the form of directed research, tutorials and individual study) in an organized format.

Students may only take at most ONE Directed Studies course during their PhD program.

Instructions (Please type or print legibly):

- 1 The student must speak to the faculty supervisor or Graduate Program Director to obtain approval and develop a proposal. Once approval is obtained, establish who is going to be the Course Instructor.
- 2- Develop a proposal/course outline with the Instructor (please see the next section for details on what is required).
- 3- Complete this form, attach the course outline, and submit it along with a Course Action Request form to the Graduate Program Administrator.
- 4- Graduate Program Administrator will get the Graduate Program Directors Signature.
- 5- Once approved, the Graduate Program Administrator will process (register the student) and send scanned copy to the Student and Course Instructor.

General Information:

- a) The deadline to submit a Directed Studies Request Form to your Program Administrator is before the start of the term in which you are to take a course but will be accepted until the last date to add a course for that term. See YSGS significant dates for deadlines.
- b) The amount of the level of credit to be awarded for the course must be equivalent to the amount and level of credit awarded to a three hour course regardless of format or mode of delivery.

) Normally, the official "Classes End" date of a term is the submission deadline of an independent study course.
